Before we bring our needs to God, we begin by focusing on who He is. God's holiness means He is utterly unique, pure, and set apart from all sin. His holiness is His beauty and majesty, and it is the foundation of our worship. Use the following Scriptures and prompts to guide prayers of praise and adoration.

01

GOD'S HOLY IN HIS MAJESTY

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" (Isa. 6:3)
Praise God that He is exalted above all creation.

Adore Him as the One whose glory fills heaven and earth.

Prayer Prompt: "Lord, You are high and lifted up. There is no one like You in majesty and glory. I worship You as the King of all the earth."

GOD'S HOLY IN HIS PURITY

"Your eyes are too pure to look on evil; you cannot tolerate wrongdoing." (Hab. 1:13)
Thank God that He is completely pure and unstained by sin.

Celebrate that His holiness is the standard of goodness and truth.

Prayer Prompt: "Lord, You are perfectly pure and good. I adore You because there is no darkness in You at all. You are light and truth."

GOD'S HOLY IN HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS AND JUSTICE

"The LORD is righteous in all his ways and faithful in all he does." (Ps. 145:17)
Praise God for His perfect justice and righteous rule.

Celebrate that His judgments are always right and fair.

Prayer Prompt: "Lord, You are righteous in all Your ways. I praise You because You always judge rightly and Your justice is perfect."

GOD'S HOLY IN HIS LOVING FAITHFULNESS

"Who is like you, O LORD, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders?" (Ex. 15:11)

Thank God that His holiness is not cold distance but expressed in His faithful love to His people.

Praise Him for His covenant love that never fails.

Prayer Prompt: "Lord, Your holiness is full of mercy and steadfast love. I worship You for Your faithful love that endures forever."

GOD'S HOLINESS REVEALED IN CHRIST

"But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ..." (1 Cor. 6:11)

Praise Jesus as the Holy One who makes us holy.

Celebrate that His life, death, and resurrection reveal God's holiness in saving grace.

Prayer Prompt: "Jesus, You are the Holy One of God. I praise You because through Your blood You have made me holy and brought me near to God."

Ten Commandments

In chapel this year, we will be working through the Ten Commandments. Our hope is that students will see them as more than rules for what to do and what not to do. Our hope is that our students would see in them the character and nature of God. Please take the next few minutes to pray through the following requests from the Ten Commandments.

1. “You shall have no other gods before me.” (Ex. 20:3)

Pray that we would love God above all else, finding our satisfaction in Him alone (Matt. 22:37; Ps. 73:25).

Pray that we would resist idols of success, popularity, and comfort (1 John 5:21; Jer. 2:13).

Pray that our school community would be marked by wholehearted devotion to the Lord (Josh. 24:15; Rom. 12:1).

2. “You shall not make for yourself a carved image.” (Ex. 20:4–6)

Pray that we would worship God as He truly is, not according to our own imagination (John 4:24).

Pray that we would treasure the unseen glory of Christ more than visible, worldly attractions (2 Cor. 4:18).

Pray that our worship would be pure and Christ-centered, not performance-driven (Col. 3:16–17).

3. “You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.” (Ex. 20:7)

Pray that we would honor God’s name in our speech and actions (Matt. 6:9).

Pray that our school would be known for truth, integrity, and reverence toward God (Prov. 18:10).

Pray that students would live in such a way that God’s name is glorified, not profaned (Ezek. 36:23).

4. “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.” (Ex. 20:8–11)

Pray that we would find true rest in Christ, our Sabbath rest (Matt. 11:28–30; Heb. 4:9–10).

Pray that families would set aside time for worship and renewal (Is. 58:13–14).

Pray that our school community would grow in rhythms of rest, worship, and service (Ps. 92:1–2).

5. “Honor your father and your mother.” (Ex. 20:12)

Pray that students would respect and obey their parents with joy (Eph. 6:1–3).

Pray that teachers and leaders would set godly examples of authority and love (1 Thess. 2:7–12).

Pray that families in our community would be strengthened in love and unity (Col. 3:20–21).

6. “You shall not murder.” (Ex. 20:13)

Pray that we would value all human life as made in God’s image (Gen. 1:27).

Pray for hearts free from anger, bitterness, and hatred (Matt. 5:21–22).

Pray that we would be peacemakers in our relationships and communities (Rom. 12:18; Matt. 5:9).

7. “You shall not commit adultery.” (Ex. 20:14)

Pray for purity in thought, word, and deed (Matt. 5:27–28; Ps. 119:9).

Pray that students would honor God with their bodies (1 Cor. 6:18–20).

Pray that marriages in our school community would be faithful, loving, and Christ-centered (Heb. 13:4).

8. “You shall not steal.” (Ex. 20:15)

Pray that we would be content and generous, not greedy (Phil. 4:11–13; Heb. 13:5).

Pray that students would respect others’ property and work hard with integrity (Eph. 4:28).

Pray that our school community would be known for generosity and sharing (Acts 20:35).

9. “You shall not bear false witness.” (Ex. 20:16)

Pray that we would speak truth in love (Eph. 4:25).

Pray against gossip, slander, and false accusations in our school (Prov. 6:16–19).

Pray that our words would build others up instead of tearing them down (Eph. 4:29).

10. “You shall not covet.” (Ex. 20:17)

Pray that we would be satisfied in Christ and not envy others (Phil. 4:19; Ps. 16:5–6).

Pray that students would rejoice in the successes and blessings of others (Rom. 12:15).

Pray that our hearts would overflow with gratitude for God’s good gifts (1 Thess. 5:16–18; James 1:17).

Pray for diligence in studies and faithfulness in small things (Col. 3:23; Luke 16:10).

Pray that friendships would be marked by love, kindness, and encouragement (John 13:34–35; Heb. 10:24).

For Our Chapel Services

Pray that God's Word would be faithfully preached and heard (2 Tim. 4:2; Rom. 10:17).

Pray that worship would be sincere, Spirit-filled, and focused on Christ (John 4:24; Col. 3:16).

Pray that hearts would be softened and lives transformed through God's presence (Ezek. 36:26; Acts 2:42–47).
